SAFETY TIPS TO ENHANCE SECURITY AND CRIME PREVENTION

Residence

- Follow entry and exit protocols, and verify the IDs of unfamiliar individuals.
- Get to know your neighbours, you might need them in an emergency.
- Ensure that CCTV cameras and monitored alarms are installed and operational.
- Confirm that the complex has secure gated or boom-gated car park entries.

Property

- Mark your property and record details.
- Install a doorbell camera or peephole to your front door.
- Ensure all doors and windows have locks.
- Keep windows and doors locked, especially on ground floors, even when at home.
- Install an alarm and personal CCTV system.

Safety tips for carparks & garages

- Ensure car parks have secured access (keypad, swipe card, etc.) and are well-lit, with sensor-activated or timer floodlights.
- Check that fences are high enough to prevent easy access.
- Display warning signs prominently (e.g., trespassers will be prosecuted, card access required, CCTV in operation).
- Install security lighting and maintain it regularly.
- Ensure CCTV cameras cover entrances and exits.
- Keep landscaping trimmed to reduce concealment opportunities.
- Install duress alarm capability into the security system.
- Monitor control of swipe cards closely and require all tenants to swipe in individually.

Safety tips for vehicles

- Lock your vehicle securely and ensure your number plates are correct and attached.
- Use high-quality locks and strong cables/ chains for bikes and motorcycles.
- Keep gates and access points locked at all times.
- Wait for gates or doors to close behind you before moving off.
- In a car park, stop no more than 1.5 car lengths inside to prevent unauthorised entry.
- Don't follow another vehicle into the car park without swiping in.
- Be vigilant of suspicious individuals attempting to enter behind you.
- Register your CCTV system on the State CCTV register, Cam Map WA.
