


Western Australia

- Seasonally adjusted employment in Western Australia increased by 0.1% to 1,335,943 during January.
- Full-time employment rose by 3,972 persons during the month while part-time employment fell by 3,181 persons.
- Employment rose by 1.3% in annual average terms and dropped by 0.4% over the three months to January 2019. Full-time employment contributed 0.8 percentage points to annual growth, while part-time employment contributed 0.6 percentage points.
- In less volatile trend terms, employment decreased by 0.1% between December and January, and rose by 1.3% in annual average terms.

Australia

- Australia's seasonally adjusted employment rose by 0.3% to 12,751,813 during January.
- Full-time employment rose by 65,370 persons while part-time fell by 26,290 persons during the month.
- Employment grew by 2.6% in annual average terms and increased by 0.7% in the three months ending in January. Full-time employment contributed 1.8 percentage points to annual growth, whilst part-time employment made a 0.8 percentage point contribution.





- Over the year to January, the largest increase in seasonally adjusted employment by State was 3.5% in New South Wales. The smallest increase was 1.0% in Tasmania.
- Australia's trend employment rose by 0.2% between December and January, and grew by 2.6% in annual average terms.


Western Australia

- Seasonally adjusted employment in Western Australia decreased by 0.4% to 1,355,025 during December.
- Full-time employment fell by 6,292 persons during the month while part-time employment rose by 966 persons.
- Employment rose by 0.9% in annual average terms and grew by 0.1% over the three months to December 2019. Full-time employment contributed 0.9 percentage points to annual growth, while part-time employment did not contribute to growth.
- In less volatile trend terms, employment was unchanged between November and December, and rose by 1.0% in annual average terms.

Australia

- Australia's seasonally adjusted employment rose by 0.2% to 12,981,647 during December.
- Full-time employment fell by 308 persons while part-time rose by 29,204 persons during the month.
- Employment grew by 2.3% in annual average terms and increased by 0.3% in the three months ending in December. Full-time employment contributed 1.6 percentage points to annual growth, whilst part-time employment made a 0.6 percentage point contribution.
- Over the year to December, the largest increase in seasonally adjusted employment by State was 3.4% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.2% in Tasmania.
- Australia's trend employment rose by 0.1% between November and December, and grew by 2.4% in annual average terms.




