


- Merchandise exports from Western Australia increased by 23.9% to \$39.9 billion in the three months to January compared to the same period the previous year. Exports rose by 18.2% in the 12 months to January 2019.
- The value of exports from Australia increased by 19.0% to \$91.8 billion in the three months to January compared to the same period the previous year. Exports rose by 15.1% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to January, the largest increase in exports by State was 18.2%, in Western Australia. The smallest increase was 4.3%, in South Australia.

Imports

- The value of imports in Western Australia increased by 3.7% to \$8.2 billion in the three months to January 2019 compared to the same period in 2018, and fell by 10.6% over the year to January 2019.
- Australia's imports increased by 7.1% to \$78.4 billion in the three months to January compared to the same period a year earlier. Imports rose by 5.1% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to January, the largest increase in imports by State was 14.6% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 10.6% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 31% to \$113 billion in the year to January 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$42.5 billion nationally and a deficit of \$70.5 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.





- The value of exports from Australia increased by 16.4% to \$90.3 billion in the three months to February compared to the same period the previous year. Exports rose by 15.9% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to February, the largest increase in exports by State was 19.9%, in Western Australia. The smallest increase was 2.8%, in South Australia.

Imports

- The value of imports in Western Australia decreased by 0.1% to \$8.1 billion in the three months to February 2019 compared to the same period in 2018, and fell by 11.3% over the year to February 2019.
- Australia's imports increased by 2.9% to \$72.9 billion in the three months to February compared to the same period a year earlier. Imports rose by 4.1% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to February, the largest increase in imports by State was 17.6% in Tasmania. The largest decrease was 11.3% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 33.8% to \$115.9 billion in the year to February 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$45.7 billion nationally and a deficit of \$70.2 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.





- The value of exports from Australia increased by 14.6% to \$89.6 billion in the three months to March compared to the same period the previous year. Exports rose by 16.7% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to March, the largest increase in exports by State was 21.1%, in Western Australia. The smallest increase was 1.0%, in South Australia.

Imports

- The value of imports in Western Australia decreased by 2.8% to \$8.1 billion in the three months to March 2019 compared to the same period in 2018, and fell by 13.0% over the year to March 2019.
- Australia's imports increased by 3.6% to \$73.4 billion in the three months to March compared to the same period a year earlier. Imports rose by 3.8% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to March, the largest increase in imports by State was 25.3% in Tasmania. The largest decrease was 13.0% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 36.4% to \$117.8 billion in the year to March 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$49.1 billion nationally and a deficit of \$68.7 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.





- Over the year to April, the largest increase in exports by State was 22.4%, in Western Australia. The smallest increase was 2.3%, in South Australia.

Imports

- The value of imports in Western Australia decreased by 7.6% to \$7.8 billion in the three months to April 2019 compared to the same period in 2018, and fell by 14.7% over the year to April 2019.
- Australia's imports increased by 3.5% to \$72.4 billion in the three months to April compared to the same period a year earlier. Imports rose by 3.2% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to April, the largest increase in imports by State was 18.2% in Tasmania. The largest decrease was 14.7% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 39.1% to \$120.8 billion in the year to April 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$52.8 billion nationally and a deficit of \$67.9 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.





- Over the year to May, the largest increase in exports by State was 24.2%, in Western Australia. The smallest increase was 0.2%, in South Australia.

Imports

- The value of imports in Western Australia decreased by 12.3% to \$7.7 billion in the three months to May 2019 compared to the same period in 2018, and fell by 16.9% over the year to May 2019.
- Australia's imports increased by 3.2% to \$75.7 billion in the three months to May compared to the same period a year earlier. Imports rose by 3.3% over the year in rolling annual terms.
- Over the year to May, the largest increase in imports by State was 15.8% in Tasmania. The largest decrease was 16.9% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 42.9% to \$125.1 billion in the year to May 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$58.1 billion nationally and a deficit of \$67 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.





- Over the year to June, the largest increase in imports by State was 23.0% in Tasmania. The largest decrease was 18.6% in Western Australia.

Trade Balance

- WA's merchandise trade surplus increased by 44.2% to \$129.2 billion in the year to June 2019. This compares to a surplus of \$65.4 billion nationally and a deficit of \$63.8 billion for the rest of Australia excluding Western Australia.
