





Estimated Resident Population, March 2019

Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.4% (or 9,991 people) over the quarter and rose by 1.0% (or 25,978 people) through the year to March 2019, to stand at 2,615,794 people.
- WA's population growth of 25,978 people over the year to March 2019 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 17,891 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 1.0% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 16,112 people, contributing 0.6 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -8,025 people, contributing -0.31 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.9% (or 22,711 people) over the year to the March quarter 2019.



Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.5% (or 118,581 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 388,763 people) in the 12 months to March 2019, to 25,287,394 people.
- Over the year to March 2019, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.1% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.4% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the March quarter grew by 1.6%.




Estimated Resident Population, June 2019


Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.2% (or 5,882 people) over the quarter and rose by 1.1% (or 27,499 people) through the year to June 2019, to stand at 2,621,680 people.
- WA's population growth of 27,499 people over the year to June 2019 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 18,064 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 1.1% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 15,886 people, contributing 0.6 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -6,451 people, detracting 0.25 percentage points.
- increased by 1% (or 24,592 people) over the year to June quarter 2019

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.3% (or 75,551 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.5% (or 381,619 people) in the 12 months to June 2019, to 25,364,307 people.
- Through the year to June 2019, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.1% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.5% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to June quarter grew by 1.6%.





Estimated Resident Population, September 2019

Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 9,048 people) over the quarter and rose by 1.1% (or 29,320 people) through the year to September 2019, to stand at 2,630,557 people.
- WA's population growth of 29,320 people over the year to September 2019 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 17,902 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 1.1% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 17,071 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -5,653 people, detracting 0.22 percentage points.
- increased by 1% (or 26,383 people) over the year to September quarter 2019



Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.4% (or 98,545 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.5% (or 371,107 people) in the 12 months to September 2019, to 25,464,116 people.
- Through the year to September 2019, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.0% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.6% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to September quarter grew by 1.6%.




Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 8,244 people) over the quarter and rose by 1.3% (or 33,237 people) through the year to December 2019, to stand at 2,639,080 people.
- WA's population growth of 33,237 people over the year to December 2019 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 18,499 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 1.3% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 18,862 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -4,124 people, detracting 0.16 percentage points.
- increased by 1.1% (or 29,157 people) over the year to December quarter 2019

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.3% (or 70,234 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.4% (or 349,833 people) in the 12 months to December 2019, to 25,522,169 people.
- Through the year to December 2019, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 1.9% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.4% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to December quarter grew by 1.5%.
