


Licensing and approvals

The former Department of Environment Regulation (now the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation) had responsibility under Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) for the licencing and registration of prescribed premises and the issuing of works approvals.


Major resource projects - works approval applications



In Quarter 4, 2016–17 (the quarter):

• No new applications were received and no decisions were made by the end the quarter. The one open application at the end of Quarter 3 was reclassified to an 'Other project – works approval application'.

Major resource projects – licence applications



In the quarter:

- DER did not decide any major resource projects licence applications.
- One new application was received and six applications were not decided by the end of the quarter.

Other projects – works approval applications



In the quarter:

- DER decided 60 per cent (of 15 in total) of other project works approvals applications within 60 working days.
- 25 new applications were received and 49 applications were not decided by the end of the quarter.
- The average time for decisions was 64 working days.

Other projects - licence applications




In the quarter:

- DER decided 89 per cent (of 9 in total) of other project licences applications within 60 working days.
- 31 new applications were received and 86 applications were not decided by the end of the quarter.
- The average time for decisions was 36 working days.

Native vegetation clearing permit applications


Applications decided



In the quarter:

- 57 per cent (of 90 in total) of native vegetation clearing permit applications were decided within 60 working days.
- 116 new applications were received and 187 applications were not decided by the end of the quarter.
- The average time for decisions was 63 working days.

Hectares granted or refused



In the quarter:

• 75 hectares were refused (two applications) and 903 hectares were granted (71 applications).

Contaminated sites

Under the *Contaminated Sites Act 2003*, known or suspected contaminated sites must be reported to the Department, investigated and, if necessary, cleaned up (remediated).

To report a known or suspected contaminated site, a Form 1 must be completed, signed and submitted to the Department.




In the quarter:

- 100 per cent (of 125 in total) of Form 1s were processed within the 45 calendar day target.
- 207 new Form 1s were received and 88 were not decided by the end of the quarter.

Compliance and enforcement

Environmental Regulation Compliance Program 2016–17



In the quarter:

• The Annual Compliance Program 2016–17 achieved 90 per cent of its annual target (1,245) by the end of Quarter 4.

^{*} This program was delivered on an 'as needed' basis. As such, it had no targets attached.

Controlled waste licences

The Department administered the EP (controlled waste) Regulations 2004, which provide for the licensing of carriers, drivers and vehicles involved in transporting waste on roads in Western Australia.



In the quarter:

 113 new controlled waste licence applications were received, with 100 per cent assessed within the 30 calendar day statutory target.

Enforcement activity



In the quarter:

- 65 per cent of investigations** (of 1,024 in total) were finalised within 60 working days.
- There were 707 new matters recorded and 325 matters ongoing at the end of the quarter.
- The average time taken to finalise matters was 17 calendar days.
- * Q1, Q2, Q3 and Q4 16–17: These figures have been updated using a revised methodology to more accurately capture matters being investigated by the Department.
- ** Matters investigated can include but are not limited to complaints/incidents relating to emissions and discharges; controlled waste transportation; clearing of native regulation; illegal dumping; and issues identified by departmental officers through the course of their duties.

Licence and works approval – applications for amendment

The following revised target timeframes now apply for applications for amendment:

- major amendments those which may adversely affect the risk of the premises: 80% of applications finalised within 60 working days; and
- minor amendments those which do not adversely affect the risks of the premises: 80% of applications finalised within 40 working days.

The previous financial year's data on amendments are available in previous Quarterly Performance Reports.
