In regard to the Senate report there are agreed outcomes from the Senate which should be considered. However, it is an indication of the significance of the rock art that political strategizing has created a segmented report which is of little relevance and diminishes the validity of the report.

Also of note is that with both the Senate inquiry and this Strategy, Murujuga Aboriginal Corporation, were not initially appropriately consulted and this was remedied with the Senate hearings.

Can I please refer the Department to the Murujuga Cultural Management Plan which has considerable material of relevance.
