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Introduction to Greater Bunbury Region Scheme minor amendments

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) is responsible for keeping the Greater Bunbury Region Scheme (GBRS) under review and initiating changes where they are seen as necessary.

The GBRS sets out the broad pattern of land use for the whole Greater Bunbury area. The GBRS is constantly under review to best reflect regional planning and development needs.

An amendment proposal to change land use reservations and zones in the GBRS is regulated by the *Planning and Development Act 2005*. That legislation provides for public submissions to be made on proposed amendments.

For a non-substantial amendment, often referred to as a minor amendment (made under Section 57 of the Act), the WAPC considers all the submissions lodged, and publishes its recommendations in a *Report on Submissions*. This report is presented to the Minister for Planning for approval. The amendment takes legal effect with Gazettal of the Minister's approval.

In the process of making a non-substantial amendment to the GBRS, information is published as a public record under the following titles:

Amendment Report

This document is available from the start of the public advertising period of the proposed amendment. It sets out the purpose and scope of the proposal, explains why the amendment is considered necessary, and informs people how they can comment through the submission process.

Environmental Review Report

The Environmental Protection Authority must consider the environmental impact of an amendment to the GBRS before it can be advertised. While formal assessment would be unlikely for a non-substantial amendment, were it required then an environmental review would be undertaken and made available for information and comment at the same time as the *Amendment Report*.

Report on Submissions

The planning rationale, determination of submissions and the WAPC's recommendations for final approval of the amendment, with or without modification, is documented in this report.

Submissions

This document contains a reproduction of all written submissions received by the WAPC on the proposed amendment.

REPORT ON SUBMISSIONS

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Greater Bunbury Region Scheme Amendment 0046/57 Bunbury Airport Expansion offset and reservation anomaly, Lot 706 and 505 South Western Highway, Davenport

1 Introduction

The purpose of this amendment proposal is to rationalise the Greater Bunbury Region Scheme (GBRS) zones and reservations of portion Lots 505 and 706 South Western Highway, Davenport to complete the necessary actions required to be undertaken by the City of Bunbury in regard to agreed Federal and State environmental offsets associated with the expansion of the Bunbury Airport, and to rectify a minor mapping anomaly.

The proposal will see an area of just over 11 hectares rezoned to the Regional Open Space reservation as part of the environmental offset.

2 The proposed amendment

The City of Bunbury have recently undertaken the expansion of the Bunbury Airport to facilitate a new rescue helicopter facility and additional hangars. This was subject of previous GBRS amendment 0039/57 which was Gazetted in 20 October 2015.

In order to meet the environmental offset requirements set by the State and Federal Governments (Clearing Permit 5589/1 and EPBC approval 2013/6872) for the airport expansion the City of Bunbury are required to reserve a portion of Lot 706 as Regional Open Space on or before 30 March 2018.

Due to an administrative error in the processing of the Legal Plans for Amendment 0039/57 a small area of the Public Purposes - Airport reservation on Lot 505 did not transfer to the Rural zone as proposed in the amendment, as such this anomaly is now being rectified.

The proposal will rezone approximately 11.8ha of land from Rural to the Regional Open Space Reservation (portion Lot 706) and approximately 1.6 ha of land from Public Purposes - Airport reservation to the Rural zone (Portion Lot 505).

The land to be reserved Regional Open Space, as described in the City of Bunbury's Offset Management Plan, includes vegetation with condition found to be Very Good (43%) or Very Good to Good (38%) and Good (16%) and provides suitable habitat for both Western Ringtail Possums and Black Cockatoos. The offset site will also be managed to mitigate the threats (weed, rubbish dumping, dieback) to the remnant native vegetation and Western Ringtail Possum/black cockatoo habitat.

It is anticipated that upon the formal creation of the Preston River to Ocean Regional Park, the additional areas of Regional Open Space subject of and adjacent to this amendment will be included within the regional park.

The land to be zoned Rural is contained within Lot 505 and is outside of Lot 507 which contains the airport infrastructure and is surplus to the requirements of the operation. Transferring the land to the Rural zone is consistent with the zoning of the adjoining land.

The City of Bunbury have resolved to initiate Amendment No. 67 to Town Planning Scheme No. 7 to amend the zoning to be consistent with the GBRS as amended.

3 Formal Environmental Protection Authority advice

The EPA has advised that the proposed amendments do not require formal assessment under part IV Division 3 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*. A copy of the notice from the EPA is included at Appendix A.

4 Call for Submissions

The proposed amendment was advertised in the Government Gazette on 17 January and remained open for public submissions until 17 March 2017.

The proposed amendment was also available for public inspection at the following locations:

- i) the Department of Planning, 140 William Street, Perth;
- ii) the Department of Planning, 61 Victoria Street, Bunbury;
- iii) the municipal office of the City of Bunbury; and
- iv) the State Reference Library, Northbridge.

Notice of the proposed amendment was also published in the Western Australian and the South Western Times.

Owners adjacent to the land subject to the proposed amendment were provided with a copy of the Amendment Report and advised of the opportunity to lodge a submission in respect of the proposed amendment.

5 Submissions

When the advertising of the proposed amendment closed, a total of 4 submissions had been received.

Of the submissions, all provided no comment or advice without objecting to the proposed amendment.

The submissions were from the Department of Water, Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Environment Regulation and Department of Aboriginal Affairs.

A list of the parties who lodge a submission is attached at Appendix B and a copy of each submission is attached to the end of this report.

6 Issues raised in Submissions

No issues were raised in the submissions.

7 Modifications to the amendment

After considering the submission received in respect of the proposed amendment, the WAPC recommended the Minister for Planning approve the proposed amendment, as advertised.

8 Co-ordination of Region and Local Scheme Amendments

Section 126(1) of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* allows for the concurrent amendment of a Local Planning Scheme to a reserve for any public purpose by force of this section and without any further action under the Act. The Regional Open Space reservation will therefore automatically be in place in the City of Bunbury's Local Planning Scheme upon Gazettal.

As previously advised in the amendment report for 0039/57, the City of Bunbury have resolved to initiate Amendment No.67 to Town Planning Scheme No.7 to amend the zoning to be consistent with the GBRS as amended, which will include the portion of Lot 505. This amendment to the local scheme will resolve the rural component of the anomaly.

8 Conclusion and recommendation

The report summarises the background and reasoning for Amendment 0046/57 to the Greater Bunbury Region Scheme and examines the submissions received. The WAPC thanks those who made submissions.

After considering the submissions received, the WAPC is satisfied the proposed amendment should be finalised, and has recommended the Minister for Planning approve the amendment.

10 Minister's decision

Amendments to the Greater Bunbury Region Scheme using the provisions of section 57 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* require the WAPC to provide a report and recommendation to the Minister for Planning for approval. The Minister may approve, approve with modification or decline to approve the proposed amendment.

The Minister, after considering the amendment, has agreed with the recommendation of the WAPC and approved the amendment.

GBRS Amendment 0046/57 is now finalised as advertised as shown on WAPC Amending Plan 3.2695 and has effect in the Greater Bunbury Region Scheme from the date of notice in the *Government Gazette* on 26 May 2017.


