# GOVERNMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA Procurement Act 2020

## Strategic Forward Procurement Planning – Material Contract Variations

#### Purpose<sup>1</sup>:

The General Procurement Direction 2021 / 01: Western Australian Procurement Rules (the Rules) require State agencies to provide the Department of Finance (Finance) with annual strategic forward procurement plans that identify planned procurements valued at over \$250,000 across the next two financial years.

This Direction modifies Rule F6 of the Rules to allow agencies more time to develop systems and processes to comply with all elements of Rule F6.

### **Strategic Forward Procurement Planning**

State agencies must comply with Rule F6, Strategic Forward Procurement Planning, of the Rules.

Rule F6(3)(d) requires agencies to "attach [to their strategic forward procurement plans] from the State agency's contract register analysis of material contract Variations that have previously occurred, which may inform procurement planning for the relevant period."

This General Procurement Direction: 2022 / 2 amends Rule F6(3)(d) such that the analysis of material contract variations is not required to be attached to a State agency's strategic forward procurement plan, but must be supplied to Finance upon request.
