FDVRT Central

Commissioning



Deliverables -

1. a business case to Government for an uplift on funding for family and domestic violence refuges and safe houses, to address immediate viability and sustainability concerns. The draft business case is to be completed by September 2022; and
2. a family and domestic violence strategic commissioning plan, by 30 June 2023.

The **business case** will seek funding from Government to maintain existing service models. It is about providing the funding required to meet increasing cost of service delivery for women's refuges and safe houses to provide for sustainability of services through the life of their current contracts.

The **strategic commissioning plan** will provide direction about reform of existing family and domestic violence services funded by Communities (existing investment), the priorities for future investment towards an ideal state (desired outcomes) and the priorities for asset (building) redevelopment and refurbishment. In scope of this plan is all Communities contracts (service and grant agreements) for family and domestic violence services funded into the community sector and with Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations.

Timeframes



- The Expert Reference Group has now met on two occasions, 27 June and 18 July. The focus of these discussions has been refining the scope of work and finalising terms of reference.
- Milestone dates going forward include:
 - meetings of the ERG in the week of 8 August and week of 29 August
 - sector engagement to commence week of 5 September



Business case

Objective: Make the case for a funding uplift for FDV women's refuges and safe houses to address immediate viability and sustainability concerns over the life of the current contracts.

The business case will include:

- Financial analysis of the contemporary cost of operation for women's refuges and safe houses
- Mapping of current refuge and safe house funding, locations and service models
- Funding history, including reasons for service sustainability issues
- Evidence and explanation of:
 - The demand for women's refuges and safe houses – incl. service usage and unmet demand
 - Client profiles and the complexity of their needs
 - The support needed from both a victim/survivor and service provider perspective, including why intense support is required and the outcomes it enables.

Key inputs:

- Service funding and operating costs
- Data on:
 - All currently funded services – service models, capacity, assets and conditions by location
 - Contracting history
 - Service usage and client profiles
 - Unmet need (multiple indicators)
- Consultation findings from previous sector engagements
- Existing information and evidence from fatality reviews, oversight agency recommendations, and evaluation reports
- Further advice and insights from sector and key stakeholders
