

5 red flags when dealing with a scammer

1. An email or text message may be too good to be true or threaten to ruin your reputation.



2. A tight deadline. You might receive a message telling you to act now or urgently send money.



3. Obvious design or spelling errors.

4. Unexpected requests for money. An unusual contact might ask to send money via wire transfer or gift cards.



5. Requests for personal information such as login details, credit card numbers or mother's maiden name.
