

WA Buy Local Policy 2022 (WA BLP 2022)

Update released in April 2022

- Ensures the approx. \$30 billion spent in State Government contracts creates more work for regional WA businesses.
- Regional Price Preferencing:
 - Regional business preference;
 - Regional content preference.
- 43 Agencies have now signed Implementation Agreements and are applying WA BLP 2022.
- Changes made in April 2022 to help local businesses employing people with a disability win work.

- LCAs take a lead role in promoting supply opportunities and facilitating regional business capability and growth.

Local Capability Fund

Goldfields / Esperance Regional Round 2023

- To enhance the capacity, capability and competitiveness of Goldfields / Esperance businesses to supply Government or the private sector.
- \$100,000 total fund – 75% of eligible costs up to \$20,000 per business.
- To be eligible, applicants must:
 - Hold an ABN, be GST registered, and be for profit;
 - Be principally based in the Goldfields/Esperance region;
 - Have been in businesses for at least 12 months; and
 - Employ less than 200 people








Procurement Act, Procurement Rules, Social Procurement Framework





Underutilisation - WA Labour Market




Apprenticeship and Traineeship Commencements - WA





Apprenticeship and Traineeship Commencements Goldfields – Esperance region






State Government Incentives

Never better to have an apprentice or trainee

- Fees halved for ~170 qualifications – free in 2023 for a further 100
- Available at all WA TAFE colleges, and selected private training providers
 - Travel and Accommodation Allowance (TAA)
- Employer Incentives
 - Jobs and Skills WA (JSWA) Employer Incentive
 - Payroll Tax Exemption (PTE)
 - Group Training Wage Subsidy
 - Construction Training Fund (CTF) incentives





Commonwealth Government incentives



Priority Wage Subsidy

- For employers of new or recommencing apprentices/trainees undertaking a Certificate III or higher, in occupations on the Commonwealth's Priority List
- 10% of wages for first and second year apprentices (up to \$1,500 per quarter), and 5% of wages for third year apprentice (up to \$750 per quarter)

Hiring Incentive


- For employers of new or recommencing apprentices/trainees undertaking a Certificate II or higher, in occupations that are not on the Commonwealth's Priority List; or in a Certificate II in an occupation on the Priority List
- \$3,500 (full time A+T) and \$1,750 (part-time A+T) paid in two equal six monthly instalments

Australian Apprentice Training Support Payment

- Direct financial assistance for apprentices/trainees undertaking Certificate III or higher, in a qualification on the Priority List
- \$1,250 (full time A+T) or \$625 (part time A+T) every six months over the first two years of apprenticeship/traineeship

- *Job Ready* programs connect job seekers with employers
- Current programs in:
 - Aged and Disability Care
 - Bricklaying
 - Driller's Offsider
 - Infrastructure (Civil construction)
 - Heavy vehicle driving drivers operations
 - Future Chef
 - Early Childhood Education and Care



Western Australian State Nominated Migration Program


- Western Australia received over 10,000 places for the 2022-23 program year and the third largest allocation in Australia
- This will provide industry with access to migrant workers where skilled local workers are not available to take up jobs


Construction visa subsidy program

- New 12-month \$11m to assist construction sector employees and migrants with the costs associated with the skilled migration visa pathway.



New Migration WA website and services

- New Migration WA website which brings together information on moving to WA, living in WA and State migration services and support.
- New Skilled Migration Job Connect program.
- Assist migrants with subsidies of up to \$7,500 for costs of getting skills and qualifications recognised and obtain licenses and registrations to work in WA.
- The Skilled Migration Jobs Connect program will also offer mentoring, English language support and Australian workplace context training.

- Provides outreach services at other locations throughout the region.



Construction Training Fund



- Construction Training Fund (CTF) collect a 0.2% levy from all construction projects over \$20,000.
- This levy is reinvested into supporting a safe, skilled and sustainable construction workforce.
- Grants are available for employers who take on apprentices and subsidies are available for businesses involved in construction work to complete additional skills training including occupational health and safety, licences, and business skills.
- A \$500 Apprentice Tool and Safety Equipment rebate has just been announced, as well as an additional 150 subsidised places for employers taking on Mature Age apprentices.

Purchase Orders

For minor works, goods and services up to \$50,000 including GST, Main Roads:

- Under State Government procurement rules, only requires a single quote
- Uses Purchase Orders to accept the quote and make the payment on completion

To receive a Purchase Order:

- Suppliers/Companies need to be registered with Main Roads
- Check with your Regional office to see if you are registered
- If not, complete the form below and send it to the address on the form
- Let the Regional office know you have completed it and sent it in

Tenders

Main Roads advertises all tenders for goods, services and works valued over \$50,000 on Tenders WA (www.tenders.wa.gov.au)

- For tenders >\$50,000 and <\$250,000 a minimum of two tenders will be invited using Tenders WA. In this instance Main Roads would generally invite known companies and/or provide opportunities to new companies.
- For tenders >\$250,000 public tenders are advertised on Tenders WA

Companies are encouraged to register on Tenders WA. Email alerts can be set up to stay up to date with up coming opportunities that are relevant to your business.

The Early Tender Advice page on Tenders WA shows Main Roads' future public tender opportunities together with estimated advertising dates. These are indicative only.
