Dear Madam/Sir

My wife and I moved into [REDACTED] some ten years ago. The Village is owned by Stockland, a large listed company. All residents at that time were informed that solar panels were not an option because the electricity supplied was in the form of an embedded system whereby Stockland bought bulk supplies and resold it to residents.

Then some two years ago we were given the option to install solar panels and some residents took up this option. In late 2022 we applied to have solar panels installed and we were given a date for installation but the day prior we were told the contract was cancelled as the embedded system did not have the capacity for any further connections.

Assuming that some embedded systems do have limited capacity perhaps owners could be required to provide all users with a choice. Better still they could be required to sell buildings with the solar panels installed.
