Action updates

State Groundwater Investigation Program

Attendees at the Recharge Estimation Collaboration field day at Whiteman Park gained a better understanding of why groundwater recharge estimation is important, and were shown demonstrations of equipment to estimate recharge. “A good understanding of recharge is important to manage our groundwater systems, particularly in the face of climate change, which is causing less rainfall and disproportionately less recharge,” said DWER’s Joel Hall, Principal Environmental Modeller, who manages the Recharge Estimation Collaboration Project.



How water sensitive is my city?

The Town of East Fremantle has become the 25th local government in Western Australia to assess and enhance its urban water management performance via the Water Sensitive Cities Index tool. A benchmarking workshop was conducted on 27 April 2023, which brought together representatives from the town, community, businesses, and state agencies. Participants discussed and evaluated 34 indicators that characterise a water sensitive city. The benchmarking process offers the valuable advantage of fostering a collective understanding of East Fremantle's water management practices, while also identifying priority actions necessary for the transformation of the town into a water sensitive city.
