<p>Clause 3.2.11 (b)</p> <p>3.2.11 (b) For the purpose of paragraph 3.2.10 of this WEM Procedure, the Coordinator must notify the relevant parties via email of:</p> <p>(a) ...</p> <p>(b) a date by which the consultation must be completed, which must be at least 10 Business Days after the day of the notification; and</p> <p>(c) ...</p>	<p>Western Power recommends the addition to 3.2.11(b) of the below bolded text to allow for further, pre-agreed flexibility for timeframes for each consultation:</p> <p><i>(b) a date by which the consultation must be completed, which must be at least 10 Business Days after the day of the notification, and as agreed upon by the Coordinator and relevant parties; and</i></p>
