Community Litter Grants

Congratulations to this year's recipients of the KABC Community Litter Grants.

We received 49 Community Litter Grants applications totalling \$235,043.04. 19 applicants will be receiving a share of the \$59,671 funding.

Grants of up to \$5,000 for local projects and \$10,000 for regional projects were available.

Roadside litter program update



A new regional roadside litter prevention program is on its way! New signage will be installed along major regional roads and free car litter bags will be made available from service stations and roadhouses to encourage people to keep hold of their rubbish until they can dispose of it properly. The program focuses on the impact of litter on wildlife and will use scenic images of Western Australian native animals to highlight litter issues and will encourage travellers to 'Keep Western Australia Litter Free' and 'Bin it' as a call to action. The car litter bags will be branded as a 'Keep Bag' and will be made of compostable materials.

Highways in WA consistently appear as one of the most littered sites in the National Litter Index and, to target this, the recently released 2020-2025 WA Litter Prevention Strategy has an objective to develop programs and campaigns to address priority litter types and locations. The strategy sets a target of an overall 30 per cent reduction in litter in Western Australia over the next five years and projects such as this one, along with the Containers for Change beverage container refund scheme, should set WA on the path to meeting this target by addressing a known litter location and type. KABC will continue to partner with other organisations to develop and implement other state-wide and localised litter prevention programs.

As we find ourselves exploring our own great state more than ever before and there are more of us on our roads, it's important we be mindful of where our rubbish ends up. Keep your rubbish in the car and Bin It. Keep WA Litter Free!

Adopt-a-Spotter

After finding their usual walking routes crowded due to COVID-19 social distancing requirements, Adopt-a-Spot volunteers June Winsome-Smith and her husband James Kozak began walking along the foreshore beside Maylands Peninsula Golf Course. What they saw marked the start of their litter collecting journey in this area.



Troubled by the amount of litter and golf balls, they began collecting and recording their

findings – concluding that 50 per cent of items found came from the golf course and 50 per cent from the Swan River tides washing over the samphire wetland.



Over a two-month period they found 4,000 abandoned golf balls. They continue to discover more, all at different levels of deterioration – some of which have been abandoned for 26 years.

To date, June and James have submitted over 36 cleanup reports through the Adopt-a-Spot program. All clean-

up data is reported back to the Keep Australia Beautiful Council (KABC) at quarterly meetings.

KABC appreciates June and James's ongoing efforts and looks forward to seeing more photos as progress in the area continues.

Adopt-a-Spot is an anti-litter program that engages volunteers (individuals, community groups and business groups) to undertake litter clean ups at designated sites, on a one-off or ongoing basis. Information is available at our Adopt-a-Spot page.
