## Apply for a Working with Children Check

Information on how to apply for a Working with Children (WWC) Check in Western Australia (WA).

A

### Are you eligible?

Only people engaging in paid, unpaid or volunteer [child-related work](#), with no [exemption](#), can apply for a WWC Check in WA.

P

### Pick up a form

WWC application forms are available at [authorised Australia Post outlets](#). Your organisation may be able to provide you with a form.

P

### Provide your details

Fill in your information on the form and have your organisation sign and verify your child-related work.

Self-employed people do not need an organisation to sign their form.

L

### Lodge at Australia Post

Lodge your completed form at an authorised Australia Post outlet. You will need your identification documents and the application fee; a passport-style photo will be taken by Australia Post when you lodge.

### Your receipt lets you start work

Australia Post will give you a receipt when your form is lodged. In most cases, this lets you start or continue child-related work, while your application is assessed.
