FISHERIES ACT 1905
CLOSED WATERS NETTING (FREMANTLE TO YANCHEP) NOTICE 1991
Notice No. 512

FD 367/66
Made by the Minister under section 9, 10 and 11.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *Closed Waters Netting (Fremantle to Yanchep) Notice 1991*.

Interpretation

2. A reference to column 1, 2, 3 or 4 is a reference to the respective column in the Schedule.

Prohibition on taking fish by nets

3. Subject to clause 4 the taking of fish by means of nets in the waters specified in column 1 is prohibited other than during the times specified in column 2.

Times and means of taking fish

4. The fish listed in column 3 may be taken in the waters specified in column 1 at the times shown in column 3 by the means specified in column 4.

Revocation

5. The notice dated 19 February 1975 relating to netting closures on metropolitan beaches north of Fremantle Harbour and published in the *Gazette* of 28 February 1975 is cancelled.

1. Rous Head Boat Harbour. All waters of the Rous Head Boat Harbour adjacent to the North Mole including the waters of the Indian Ocean within 200 metres of the Rous Head Boat Harbour outer wall.	NIL.....	Crabs at any time.	(a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.
2. Rous Head Boat Harbour to Swanbourne. All that portion of the Indian Ocean bounded by a line commencing at the point of intersection of the northern extremity of the Rous Head Boat Harbour outer wall and the high water mark; thence extending in a north easterly direction along the high water mark to a point 800 metres south of the drain at Swanbourne; thence 400 metres west; thence south westerly to the intersection of the northern boundary of the closure described in	NIL.....	Crabs at any time.	(a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.

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Item 1 but excluding those waters described in item 3.			
3. Port Beach. All that portion of the Indian Ocean at Port Beach bounded by a line commencing at the western most extremity of the groyne at the northern end of Rudderham Drive at Port Beach; thence extending easterly along the northern edge of the groyne to its intersection with the high water mark; thence north easterly along the high water mark for 200 metres; thence west for 100 metres, thence south for 200 metres to its intersection with a line extending west from the commencement point; thence along that line to the commencing point.	Between 1800 hours and 0800 hours from 1 March to 30 April in any year.	Whitebait Crabs at any time	Beach seine nets. (a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.
4. City Beach. All that portion of the Indian Ocean at City Beach bounded by a line commencing at a point on the foreshore 800 metres south of the southern groyne and extending in a northerly direction to a point 800 metres north of the northern groyne with a width of 800 metres from the high water mark.	NIL.....	Crabs at any time.	(a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.
5. Scarborough Beach. All that portion of the Indian Ocean at Scarborough Beach bounded by a line commencing at a point on the foreshore fronting the western extremity of Reserve Street, and extending in a southerly direction to a point 400 metres south of Brighton Road and to a width of 800 metres from the high water mark.	NIL.....	Crabs at any time.	(a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.
6. Yanchep Beach. All that portion of the Indian Ocean at Yanchep Beach bounded by a line commencing at a point on the foreshore 800 metres northwest of the northwestern corner of Reserve 12439 and extending in a generally southeasterly direction to a point on the foreshore 400 metres southeast of the southwestern corner of the said reserve with a width of 800 metres from the high water mark.	NIL.....	Crabs at any time.	(a) drop nets; and (b) hand scoop nets.
