This document provides a summary of the findings contained in a report to this client with respect to the implementation of the client's management system as determined during an audit conducted by BSI.

Scope of certification:

The processes involved in the management of native forests and plantations in Western Australia including: the planning and supervision of harvesting operations; the transport, processing and sale of forest products; the development and maintenance of associated infrastructure; and post-harvest reestablishment activities.

Executive summary:



This report describes findings from a Surveillance Assessment of the Forest Products Commission (FPC) Western Australia forest management system (FMS) against the requirements of the Australian Standard AS/NZS4708:2021 Sustainable forest management. Previously FPC was certified to the ISO14001:2015 Standard Environmental management systems: however, the organisation has withdrawn from this certification essentially because AS/NZS4708:2021 includes ISO14001:2015 requirements in Elements 4-10.

The Surveillance Assessment was conducted concurrently with a Surveillance assessment of FPC's management system against the requirements of the PEFC2002:2020 Standard, Chain of Custody of Forest and Tree Base Products - Requirements management systems. Outcomes from this assessment are reported separately.

The audit was conducted on-site between 02-06.12.2024, at FPC's Head Office in Perth, regional offices at Bunbury and Manjimup, and these field operation sites: Ecological thinning at Gordon Jarrah and Channybearup Karri, Pine fire salvage and thinning planning at Dombakup, the Manjimup Nursery and depot operations, Pine plantation harvesting operations at Ferndale and Maidment, and Pine plantation resource expansion project at McAlinden 1. The audit also visited the Wescorp facility at Canning Vale to review Wild Sandalwood processes.

Field operation sites in these areas and supporting infrastructure were inspected. Some tasks including follow-up and reporting, were completed off-site.

The audit met BSI Group ANZ objectives and confirmed FPC has continued to develop, implement and maintain its management system to comply with requirements of the Standards at the sites assessed, and recommends Certification to the Standards AS/NZS4708:2021 be continued.

FPC Staff numbers are 165.

Scope of certification is unchanged for AS/NZS4708:2021:

The processes involved in the management of native forests and plantations in Western
Australia including: the planning and supervision of harvesting operations; the transport,
processing and sale of forest products; the development and maintenance of associated
infrastructure; and post-harvest re-establishment activities'.
