Clean Up Australia Day



We kicked off our involvement for Clean Up Australia Day at South Trigg late last month. Volunteers from Club Shakas Community joined us at Surfing WA removing 10kgs of litter from the beach and surrounding areas.

Everyone enjoyed an ice-cream and a cold drink after the event.

In Kalgoorlie, over 90 volunteers removed a huge amount of litter at the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Landcare Group

(KBULG) Clean Up event.

Thanks to KBULG and all volunteers, and the city crew who then removed the collected items to the tip.

Over the official Clean Up Australia Day weekend, we joined forces and Pia Boschetti for the Flotsam and Jetsam event. Another huge amount of marine debris was removed by volunteers from the Abrolhos Islands.

This year, with the help of officers from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, the program expanded to additional islands in the Pelsaert Group. Once the haul was unloaded and sorted at the Geraldton



Fisherman's Wharf, it was quickly taken by artists who were keen to make an amazing circus themed piece of art.

The artwork will be on display from 24 May – 13 June so if you are in Geraldton, be sure to look out for it.

Community Litter Grants

KAB WA Community Litter Grants will open next month at Love the Lesch Festival in Australiad. KAB WA staff will be attending the event providing information on all KAB WA litter prevention programs.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available for initiatives that address litter. The grants provide financial assistance for action and education on litter prevention with a total of \$60,000 available.

Clean Schools



Clean Schools travelled to Kalbarri District High School last week and delivered in-class lesson about litter and its impacts with Pre-Primary to Year 4, as well as a litter collection and audit with Year 5/6.

KAB WA's Clean Schools officer also joined with Community Litter Grants (CLG) coordinator at the filming of the

CLG promotional video. Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) students from the region came along to look first-hand at the impact of litter on the marine environment. They collected the litter and took this back to school for auditing with Mick Payne from Northern Agricultural Catchment Council (NACC).


The PEAC students played games about litter and started developing their own.

A Clean School workshop was held in Geraldton for teachers passionate about litter-prevention in their schools. This session takes teachers through the Clean Schools guide and gives ideas and resources about running a program in their own school.

We finished our time in Geraldton with a clean-up of Sunset Beach with Chapman River Friends.

Australian Litter Measure

Over the past 4 years KAB has completed six litter surveys using the new Australian Litter measure (AusLM) methodology. AusLM measures the amount, type and material of litter at 256 sites in the Perth Metro area in six different site types; beaches, roadsides, parks, residential areas, industrial sites and in retail areas.



KAB WA is gaining great insight into litter through this methodology and a much

clearer picture of what and how much litter is being dropped where. This data is used to inform KAB policy and to direct limited resources to where they are needed most.

The latest AusLM survey from November 2024 collected 13,669 items and 708 litres of litter from 106,258.84 square metres.

Cigarette Butts and filters were again found to be the most common item by count with a total of 3,217 recorded. Paper/card food packaging was the highest item by volume, with a calculated volume of 69 litres.

Main Roads and Industrial sites contained the highest levels of litter (consistent with previous surveys), whilst Beaches had the lowest.

Plastic represented the highest material found accounting for 59% of individual items counted and 33% of the calculated volume.

Good luck to Port and South Hedland with National Tidy Towns Sustainability Awards with judging to take place later this week.


